

**GUIDANCE FOR COMPLETION OF THE FIELDS ON THE VETERINARY CERTIFICATE COVERING FRESH,
CHILLED, WASHED CLASS B SHELL EGGS (EGGS FOR FURTHER PROCESSING) DESTINED FOR MEMBER
STATES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION**

Page II	Animal and Public Health Attestation Information
Page II	Signature of USDA Grader and USDA Stamp Impression
Page I	
I.1	Consignor: Enter name, address, city, state, and telephone number of the party transferring custody of the product to the consignee (brokerage firm, export coordinator, etc.).
I.2	Enter the certificate number of the Form PY-210S Issued by the USDA Grader.
I.2a	Leave blank.
I.3	Enter "USDA, AMS, Washington DC."
I.4	Enter "USDA, AMS, Federal-State Office (City & State)."
I.5	Consignee: Enter name, address, and telephone number of the agent receiving custody of the product (country of destination).
I.6	Leave blank.
I.7	United States. Refer to Exhibit IV, to confirm the two –digit ISO Code "US."
I.8	Enter address (city & state) of the Regional Office responsible for the geographical location of the egg processor/packer.
I.9	Enter the name of the Member State (country) that is the point of entry to the EU as provided by the processor/packer. Refer to Exhibit IV, for the two-digit ISO Code corresponding to the name of the Member State of the EU.
I.10	Leave blank.
I.11	Enter the origin egg processing facility name and address and USDA plant number as the "Approval Number."
I.12	Leave blank.
I.13	Enter the origin processing facility or trans-loading location (city & state) as applicable for loading of the transport container (sea vessel or air).
I.14	Enter origin processing facility date of departure of the transport container or the date provided at the time the shipment when trans-loaded as applicable.
I.15	Select, marking with an "X", the type of final transport system (airplane, ship/vessel, truck, other, etc.). Enter the name of the vessel, airline, etc. as applicable.
I.16	Enter the Border Inspection Point (BIP) for entry to EU (city/state).
I.17	Leave blank.

I.18	Enter "Fresh, Chilled, Washed Class B Shell Eggs."
I.19	Enter "04.07" (this harmonized schedule code for fresh shell eggs will not change.)
I.20	Enter "360-eggs per shipping case."
I.21	Select "Chilled" (place an "X" in the box).
I.22	Enter the total number of 30-dozen cases in the lot. For example, 800 shipping cases.
I.23	Identification of transport container (alpha-numeric digits painted or marked on unit) and seal number(s) applied to the container upon closure.
I.24	Enter "30-dozen, fiber corrugated case."
I.25	Select "Human consumption" (place an "X" in the box).
I.26	Leave blank
I.27	Select "For import or admission into EU" (place an "X" in the box).
I.28	Species: Gallus Gallus
	Scientific Name of Commodity: Fresh, Chilled, Washed Class B Shell Eggs
	Manufacturing Plant: USDA Plant Number (For example: P-1234).
	Cold Store: Unless cold storage is encountered in situations where trans-loading arrangements are required, leave blank. When placed in storage awaiting shipping, record the name and address of the cold storage facility.
	Number of packages: Enter the total number of 30-dozen shipping cases.
	Net Weight: "Enter the calculated net weight stated in the remarks section of the Form PY-210S quality certificate issued covering the number of cases of each production lot(s) on the shipment."
Page II Heading (reverse side)	
II.	Leave Blank
II.a	Enter the PY-210S Certificate Number (same as field I.2).
II.b	Leave Blank
Page II Signature Block (reverse side).	
	Name of official veterinarian: Print in capital letters the name of the USDA Grader/representative providing certification services
	Qualification and Title: Print in capital letters "USDA, AMS Grader."
	Date: Date of issuance of the document
	Signature: Signature of the USDA Inspector providing certification services. Note, each page of the shipping certificate shall be stamped and signed (blue ink).
	Stamp: Place an impression of the USDA Graded for Export stamp with certificate number in the location as shown on Exhibit VI (the USDA stamp cannot be computer generated. The stamp must be applied using blue ink on the cases as well as each page of the shipping certificate.
